3. Two teachers, from amongst the University Professors, Professors, Readers other than Head of the Departments and two lecturers having at least 10 years teaching experience shall be elected by the teacher-members of the Senate in the manner indicated below :—

Note :—Teaching experience shall be computed as laid down in explanation at the end of article 9 of Chapter-III (the Senate).

(a) A date shall be fixed for the holding of the election by the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar shall send by registered post to every teacher-member of the Senate, notice of the date fixed together with the required number of nomination papers at least 15 days before the date of meeting of the Senate and a copy of the notice shall be simultaneously displayed on the Notice Board of the University Office.

(b) Any teacher member of the Senate, may nominate any other teacher qualified to seek election, by delivering to the Registrar any time during office hours at least five clear days before the date so fixed, a nomination paper personally or through an authorised agent in the following form signed and completed by himself as proposer, and by a third teacher member thereof as seconder and declaring therein that the proposer has ascertained that the nominee is willing to act as a member of the Syndicate in case he is elected

thereto. Every person qualified to vote at the election shall be entitled to nominate for each vacancy name of one person for election as a member of the Syndicate.

✓ Provided that no teacher member shall sign, whether as proposer or seconder, nomination papers for more than the number of vacancies available in the respective categories.

(c) The Registrar shall give an acknowledgement thereof in the prescribed form.

(d) The nomination paper shall be scrutinised by the Registrar three days before the election. After completion of the scrutiny the Registrar shall forward all nomination papers to the Vice-Chancellor with his findings for approval. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor on the subject shall be final. The date and hour of the scrutiny of nomination shall be notified by the Registrar by affixing a notice on the Notice Board of the University office. The nominees or their authorised agents may be present during the scrutiny, if they so desire.

to be drawn (e) A candidate may withdraw his candidature by giving notice in writing to the Registrar by the noon of the day preceding the date of election. A candidate who has once withdrawn his candidature shall not be allowed to cancel the withdrawal.

(f) The Registrar shall on the date fixed for the election read out in the meeting of the Senate, the names of the Teacher-members who have been duly nominated together with those of their proposers and seconders. If the number of duly nominated candidate is equal to or less than the number of seats to be filled, the Vice-Chancellor shall declare them duly elected.

(g) If the number of duly nominated candidate is more than the number of seats to be filled the teacher members of the Senate present in the meeting shall proceed to elect the required number of members to the Syndicate in accordance with the system of proportional representation by means of single transferable vote by secret ballot.

(h) The ballot paper shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the Vice-Chancellor.

4 Four such members other than students or employees of the colleges or the University as are elected from amongst the members of the Senate in accordance with the system of proportionate representation by means of single transferable vote :—

(a) A date shall be fixed for holding the election by the Vice-

(b) Any non-teacher member, may nominate any other member/ members of the Senate who is qualified to seek to election by delivering to the Registrar at any time during office hours at least five clear days before the date fixed for election a nomination paper, personally or through an authorised agent in the following form signed by himself as proposer and by a third non-teacher member thereof as seconder and declaring therein that the proposer has ascertained that the nominee is willing to act as member of the Syndicate in case he is elected thereto.

Provided that no non-teacher member shall sign, whether as proposer or seconder, nomination papers for more than the number of seats to be filled.

(c) The Registrar shall give an acknowledgement thereof in the prescribed form.

(d) The nomination paper shall be scrutinised by the Registrar three days before the election. The date and hour of scrutiny of nomination papers shall be notified by the Registrar by affixing a notice on the Notice Board of the University office. The nominee or their authorised agents may be present during the scrutiny if they so desire. After completion of the scrutiny the Registrar shall forward all nomination papers to the Vice-Chancellor with his findings for approval. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor in the subject shall be final.

(e) A candidate may withdraw his candidature by giving a notice in writing to the Registrar by noon of the day preceeding the date of election. A candidate who had once withdrawn his candidature shall not be allowed to cancel the withdrawal.

(f) The Registrar shall, on the date fixed for the election read out in the meeting of the Senate the names of the candidates who have been duly nominated together with the names of their respective proposer and seconder. If the number of duly nominated candidates is equal to or less than the number of seats to be filled, the Vice-Chancellor shall declare them elected,

(g) If the number of duly nominated candidate is more than the number of seat to be filled the members of the Senate present in the meetine shall proceed to elect the required number of members to the

Syndicate in accordance with the system of Proportional representation by means of single transferable vote by secret ballot. The ballot paper shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the Vice-Chancellor.

5 If a member of the Syndicate, elected or nominated by name, is appointed to any office, the occupant whereof is by virtue of the said office entitled to the membership of the Syndicate, the elected or nominated seat of such member shall be deemed to have become vacant from the date of such appointment.

6 Whenever a vacancy occurs either by efflux of time or due to any other cause an election to fill up the vacancy shall be held according to the procedure laid down above on the date fixed by the Vice-Chancellor.

7 Where, in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, any difficulty arises in implementing the provisions of this statute or in respect of any matter relating to the election to the Syndicate, for which no provision has been made in this Statute, the Vice-Chancellor with the prior approval of the Chancellor may, notwithstanding anything contained therein, make such provisions as he thinks fit for the purpose of removing the difficulty.

Meetings

8 The Syndicate shall meet ordinarily once a month except during the vacations and at other times, when convened by the Vice-Chancellor or in his absence or when the office of the Vice-Chancellor is temporarily vacant, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall preside at the meeting of the Syndicate. When both the Vice-Chancellor and the Pro-Vice-Chancellor are absent from a meeting of the Syndicate the members of the Syndicate present shall elect a Chairman from amongst themselves.

10 The first meeting of the Syndicate after the Annual meeting of the Senate, shall be called the Annual Meeting of the Syndicate.

11 Seven members of the Syndicate shall constitute a quorum.

12 All questions shall be decided by majority of votes of the members present and voting. If the votes are equally divided, the Chairman shall have and exercise a casting vote.

13 The Syndicate shall, subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and the Statutes, have power to make rules for the guidance and the Statutes have power to make rules for the guidance of any Committee appointed by it and for other matters.

14 The Syndicate shall, from time to time, recommend to the Senate such statutes or changes in the statutes as it may consider desirable.

15 (i) The Syndicate shall have power to appoint committees from amongst its own members, and to add to such committee any member of the Senate or of the Faculty or Faculties and any expert member. The reports of such committees shall not be published nor shall any action be taken on them, until they have been considered by the Syndicate.

(ii) If any member of any such committee is absent from three consecutive meetings, the Vice-Chancellor may declare his seat on the committee vacant.

16 The minutes of the Syndicate having been duly confirmed, shall be printed and circulated to the Chancellor and the members of the Syndicate. The minutes shall also be consolidated and circulated to all the members of the Senate once a year.

17 In addition to the powers conferred and duties imposed on it by the ordinance the Syndicate shall exercise the following powers and perform the following duties :—

(1) After any proposal of the Academic Council has been received or after a report from the Academic Council has been obtained the Syndicate may recommend statutes to the Senate for institution, abolition of any post or posts of University Professor, Reader/Professor/Lecturer or other teaching posts of the University Departments and/or colleges, maintained by the University.

(2) After consulting the Finance Committee, to take and hold any property, movable or immovable, for purposes of the University by purchase, grant testamentary deposition or otherwise and to grant, demise or alienate or otherwise dispose of any other properties belonging to the University if not required by the University and also to do all other acts incidental or appertaining thereto; provided that for the grant, demises, alienation or disposal of any property of a value above Rs. 50,000/- the prior approval of the Chancellor shall be necessary,

(3) Subject to the provisions in the budget, to enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University.

(4) With the prior approval of the Senate and the State Government to institute new colleges, University Departments, Institutes and start teaching in new subjects in colleges maintained by the University after a report from the Academic Council.
